## Presentation Guidelines

You are going to create a presentation that will reflect the research, learning, writing, and advocacy you have performed in the class so far. The content for this assignment will include your genre project aka integrated assignment, where you advocate for something related to the issue you have spent the entire semester researching. This project is an opportunity for you to demonstrate your ability to locate, read, evaluate, select and use (integrate) effectively information from appropriate sources with their own ideas. Your project should include three sections: A Problem Section, An Advocacy Section, and A Results/Intended Outcome Section.

Your problem section should include the problem you are trying to address through your writing, the "so-what" or significance of your research (why one should care about your issue), and a simple explanation of your issue. This explanation should be one that is easy for your audience to understand.

Your advocacy section should include what you are advocating for (i.e., what specific change you are looking to promote). This section should also include what genre you picked and why. Therefore, you will need to explain who your audience is. Lastly, this section should show your audience the advocacy work you have created and explain to them how this genre satisfies your purpose and meets your audience's needs.

Your results section should include the process you went through both for conducting your research and creating your genre. There should be a clear connection between your topic and how it relates to POLS. Finally, this section should include what you hope to accomplish by creating and advocating for change via the genre you have selected. What do you hope will happen based on the amount of work you have put into this project.
